It was a year of change, growth, challenges and, most of all, continued commitment to the work that is being done at First Light. First Light faced what many agencies faced across the country as COVID 19 continued to affect the homeless population in a more drastic way than it ever has. But through it all we persevered and continued to provide services to the guests of First Light and to those in our housing programs. We thank you for your help in making this happen.

This annual report celebrates all we accomplished as we responded to the needs and challenges of 2021 and 2022. The work that was done during this reporting period is evidence that despite the transition and uncertainties we faced, we remained resilient.

## WHO WE SERVE

## EMERGENCY SHELTER

First Light serves single women and women with children in the emergency shelter in downtown Birmingham. Guests receive individualized case management services to help them gain the skills and resources they need to improve their situation and that of their children. These women may have experienced some form of mental illness, substance abuse addiction, sexual or physical abuse, and/or may be chronically homeless.

## SUPPORTIVE HOUSING

First Light also serves single individuals and families in its Rapid Rehousing Program, 35 single women with disabilities in its TRIO supportive housing program, and nine women in a permanent supportive housing program on the fourth floor. All of these individuals were formerly homeless but, with the help of social services support, have been able to establish stable housing in the community. Each receives case management services at home.

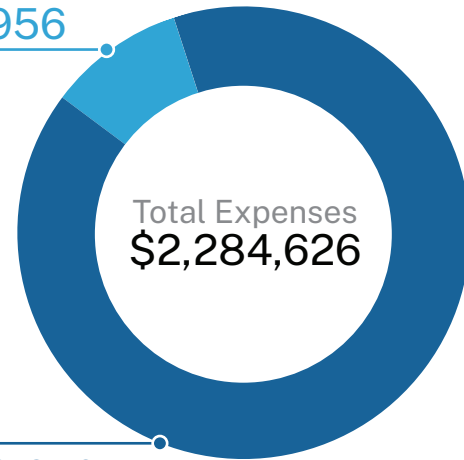

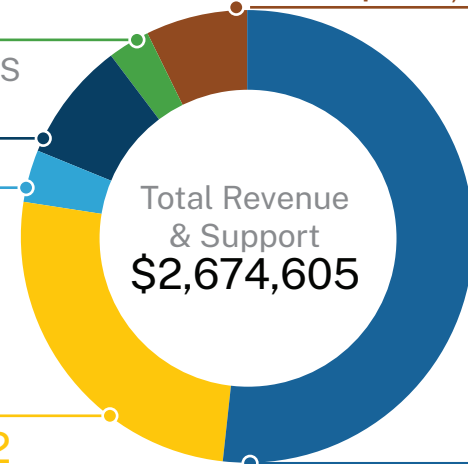
