FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

Each day at First Light, we see firsthand the strength and resilience of the women and children who walk through our doors. They come to us in crisis—often with little more than hope—and through the compassion of our staff, the dedication of our volunteers, and the generosity of our community, they begin to rebuild their lives.

At First Light, we offer more than a place to sleep. We achieved exciting milestones including increasing the number of services being offered and directing more women and children to permanent housing opportunities. We offer safety, stability, and a path forward. Our services—case management, counseling, life skills training, and more—are tailored to help each woman take the next step toward independence. And yet, as the need grows in our community, we find ourselves at a critical point. The number of women and children seeking shelter and support continues to rise. All year long, more than 750 women and women with children came through our doors seeking shelter, direction and hope. For the children, stability is key.

We have worked tirelessly to create a nurturing environment where they can learn, grow, and thrive, despite the challenges they face. Through our programs, we strive to offer them a sense of security and hope for a brighter future. Our current space, while full of care and purpose, is stretched beyond capacity. The growing demand for services has made it clear: we must expand. We must grow our space, our programs, and our resources to meet the urgent and increasing needs of those who count on us.

As we look to the future, we are actively exploring ways to expand services and to use our existing spaces more effectively. Every square foot of First Light carries potential—potential to shelter more, serve more, and offer greater stability to the women and children who need us.

This work is not easy, but it is essential. And we are not doing it alone. Our volunteers give countless hours of their time and hearts. Our donors continue to show up in meaningful ways. And our community reminds us again and again that compassion is alive and well.

To all of you who have walked with us—thank you. You are part of every success story that begins at First Light. And today, more than ever, we ask for your continued support. We are celebrating the 10th Anniversary of the Dancing with the Stars of the Magic City fundraising event held by the Junior Board and each year the contribution that they are making is more significant. This is measured not only in financial support but also in expanding the outreach and the “friends of First Light” network which reminds us of how philanthropic the citizens of Birmingham are through all generations.

Every day, more women and children turn to us for help, and we are committed to being there for them. But we cannot do it alone. 



Thanks to the generosity of our donors and partners, we continued to provide essential services to those experiencing homelessness while maintaining fiscal responsibility. Meeting Needs Through Community and Care

Thanks to vital community partnerships, First Light continues to meet the complex needs of the women we serve. Medical care is provided free of charge through our ongoing collaboration with Alabama Regional Medical Services (A.R.M.S.).

In 2024, we strengthened our network of support by forming new partnerships with Community on the Rise, Ross Recovery, Craig Crisis Center, and the Birmingham Municipal Court. These relationships expand our ability to connect women with critical resources beyond our walls.

This year over 45 women found stability through our Permanent Supportive Housing Program, designed specifically for those who have experienced chronic homelessness and are living with disabilities. In addition, our Rapid Rehousing Program helped over 65 individuals—including 36 families with children—move into safe, stable housing.

Through a combination of social services, case management, and community collaboration, we continue to offer wrap-around support to women currently in shelter and to those who have moved on to permanent housing—because stability doesn't stop at the door.

Every Step Begins with Hope

At First Light, hope is more than a feeling—it's the first step toward healing, stability, and a brighter future. And in doing so, we walk alongside women and their children as they navigate some of the most difficult moments in their lives.

Thanks to the generosity of supporters like you, our compassionate social workers are able to provide consistent, personalized support to help residents regain stability and hope. Social workers assist families with school-aged children by enrolling them in school and ensuring that each woman is aware of and accessing the full range of services First Light provides. From life skills classes to individualized case management, every resource is designed to empower residents to take the next steps with confidence.

Whether a woman moves on to permanent housing, enters a treatment program, or reconnects with family, we are honored to be part of her journey—and deeply grateful for your role in making that possible.



BY THE NUMBERS

Every number holds a story. At First Light, behind every number is a woman or child who found safety, dignity, and the first steps toward a new beginning. From the number of individuals who found stable housing to those who accessed critical support services, these outcomes highlight the power of compassion, community, and comprehensive care. 495 unduplicated persons sought shelter and received service

One Morning Changed Everything: Jackie's Story of Resilience and Hope


One morning, Jackie and her four children, arrived at First Light in the middle of winter, weary from months of uncertainty, fear, and instability. They had gotten evicted and had to leave immediately. Jackie struggled to find a safe place for them to sleep. The children, too young to understand their situation fully, just wanted a home where they could play and feel safe. But there was Jordan and at just 15 years old and for the first time, Jordan truly understood what it meant to be homeless. Jordan began to think of where he could apply for jobs to help pay rent. But his mother drilled into him that the only thing he was allowed to worry about was school. Life became uncertain, and school felt like a faraway dream—one more thing slipping through his fingers and those of his younger siblings.

Jackie knew that in order for her and her children to be safe, she had to go into a shelter. When they walked through the doors of First Light, they were met with warmth, understanding, and hope. Through the shelter's case management, Jackie received the guidance and resources she needed—housing assistance, employment assistance, and emotional support.

Slowly, Jackie regained her confidence, and with the help of the shelter's dedicated team, she secured stable employment, and the children were enrolled in school. Within four months, Jackie and her family moved into a home of their own, a place where they could finally decorate their room with drawings of superheroes and pictures of ballerinas.

Jackie's story is a powerful reminder that even in the depths of despair, there is hope. With courage, support, and the belief that she deserved a better life, Jackie stepped out of the shadows and into the light—a journey she continues to share with others who are still searching for their own second chance.

- **“My biggest worry when we were homeless was my kids. I was afraid of how it would affect them. First Light made life as normal as possible, helped my kids feel safe and loved on them when I couldn’t. They kept us moving in the right direction when I felt hopeless. I will always be grateful for that.”**

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT: RUTH COOK

Ruth Cook has been a devoted volunteer at First Light for more than 30 years. Her journey began in the early 1990s, when the shelter operated in the basement of First Presbyterian Church. As members of St. Paul's, Ruth and her husband joined a small volunteer team serving meals to women and children in need.

"When the new building opened, we were so pleased to see more interaction at mealtimes. The round tables made a real difference," Ruth recalls. Over time, Ruth's role expanded. During her time as the dinner liaison at St. Mark the Evangelist Church in Hoover, she helped grow a First Light ministry from a handful of meal providers to more than

150 monthly participants and a core team of volunteers serving onsite.

She also treasures the years her entire family came together during the holidays to serve meals- creating meaningful memories and instilling values of service across generations.

"To anyone considering volunteering, I would say this is a heaven-blessed opportunity to do something tangible and needed," Ruth shares. "First Light is more than a shelter, it's a place of hope and encouragement."

We are incredibly grateful for Ruth's decades of unwavering dedication, leadership, and compassion. Her consistency and deep care for others have touched countless lives and helped shape the heart of First Light's mission. Ruth embodies what it means to serve with purpose, and we are honored to celebrate her remarkable legacy of service.
